**Awards**

On successful completion of the course, students will be awarded a BSc (Hons) Nursing. Students who leave the course early may be eligible for a DipHE Health Studies on successful completion of 240 credits at levels 4 and 5, or a CertHE Health Studies on successful completion of 120 credits at level 4. Students who successfully complete 360 credits but do not pass practice may be eligible for a BSc (Hons) Health Studies.
